National Youth Gathering

On June 25 Dane Luebke, Ben Luebke, Katelyn Buchda, Ellie Haselow, Jacob Kerl and Jack McKee will depart, along with chaperones Amy Luebke and Dave Haselow, for the ELCA National Youth Gathering in Houston. They will ride down on a synod bus-spending the night in Little Rock, AK. While at the gathering, they will spend a day with all the youth from our synod, they will spend a day doing service in Houston and they will spend a day participating in activities and workshops to widen their faith and discipleship experiences. And each evening they will gather in the NRG Dome with 30,000 other youth to hear speakers and musicians and get a little crazy. On Sunday, Pastor Elizabeth Eaton, the presiding bishop of the ELCA will preach and lead worship in the dome. There will be communion at this service, which is a logistical nightmare when serving 30,000 people on several levels of seating. The whole thing is a very unique and powerful experience that happens every three years. We have sent youth to the gatherings since 2003 and it is wonderful that this congregation has been so supportive of the kids with financial assistance. Thank you to everyone. Keep the gathering and our youth and chaperones in your prayers. They will return to Madison early on July 2.

Rev. Viviane Thomas-Breitfeld elected bishop of the South-Central Synod of Wisconsin!

The Rev. Viviane Thomas-Breitfeld, Beloit, Wis., was elected May 6 to serve a six-year term as bishop of the South-Central Synod of Wisconsin of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America (ELCA).

The election was held during the Synod Assembly May 5-6 at the Kalahari Resort and Convention Center in Wisconsin Dells where over 500 lay leaders and rostered ministers gathered to do the work of God's church, participating in learning, fellowship and important voting matters.

Thomas-Breitfeld was elected on the fifth ballot with 224 votes to 150 votes for the Rev. Steven Kottke, assistant to the bishop of the South-Central Synod of Wisconsin.

While we recognize that this is an historic moment in the life of the ELCA in the election of the full African-descent synod bishop, (see story in Livina Lutheran https://www.livinglutheran.org/2018/05/bishop-elects-reflect-on-historic-votes/), we recognize that the bishop-elect brings many gifts to her new leadership role and ministry. She currently serves as interim pastor of St. Paul Lutheran Church in Beloit. She served as pastor of Gethsemane Lutheran Church in Brookfield, Wis., from 2010 to 2013 and Good Shepherd in Wausau, from 1992 to 2010. Rev. Thomas-Breitfeld earned a Bachelor of Science degree from Cornell University in Ithaca, N.Y., in 1974 and she received her Master of Divinity from McCormick Theological Seminary in Chicago in 1979. Rev. Mary Stumme Froiland, has served as bishop since 2013 and will complete her call on July 1. A reception and banquet in her honor were held at the synod assembly where guests were regaled with stories of her ministry and life as told by colleagues and family. We are grateful for her faithful service serving as both a congregational pastor and bishop of our synod!
