Sabbatical Time

The ELCA recommends that congregations provide an extended sabbatical or time away for a pastor every 5 years. The idea is that this time away for continued education and refreshment will bring new ideas and life to a pastor in a longer-term pastorate. On Nov 2, Pastor Dean will have been at Lakeview for 13 years. He arrived in 2001 and his first day here was for Lutefisk dinner---but he stayed anyway. The congregation council approved a sabbatical for him during the summer of 2008. He and Kris were able to do a summer study of the civil rights movement in our country. The council has recently approved a sabbatical for Pastor Dean for the summer of 2015. The sabbatical policy of the Lakeview congregation says that he can take up to 3 months of time, but must include his 4 weeks of vacation as part of that time. Right now, Pastor Dean and Kris are considering how they might use this sabbatical time and when exactly they may use it. Various schedules must be taken

into consideration before a plan can be established. When a sabbatical is taken, the congregation council contracts with a supply pastor to cover worship, funerals and other pastoral care while the called pastor is on leave.
