Kitchen Remodeling Status

After the first kitchen project estimate came to a surprising \$236,000, the congregation began taking a serious look at what we really needed in a renovated kitchen. In April we held a "listening session" where project manager Jim architect Steve Ladika and presented information on the design and the relationship of changes in the Lakeview kitchen to the Wisconsin State Codes and current building standards. They also listened and responded to questions and comments from the group. Follow up meetings, held in the kitchen with several members of Lakeview, resulted in a new kitchen design which improved the "flow" in the area and addressed the health and sanitation concerns for the remodeled work space. The representatives from Engineered Construction are revising their design and estimate for presentation the congregation in the near future.

ELCA National Youth Gathering

Nate Campbell and Colleen Kerl will chaperone our high school youth at the youth gathering July 15-19 in Detroit. This year, the high school youth going to Detroit will provide two days (July 13 and



Of course I'll miss you all but to say that I'm not looking forward to my summer sabbatical would be a serious lie. One of the most wonderful things that you have given me in my 14 years as the pastor of Lakeview is this very precious time for rest and recuperation called a "sabbatical." Kris and I were able to take one in 2008 and we are most grateful to be able to do that again this summer.

First of all, I am working on getting rid of the knee pain before we depart. I have learned that I have moderate to severe osteoarthritis in my right knee with 3 bone spurs and a section that is nearly bone on bone. My left knee has no spurs but has moderate osteoarthritis. I'm doing the exercises, taking my Aleve like a good boy, riding bike as recommended and trying to lose a few pounds. I may need a steroid injection to reduce pain later in June.

To begin sabbatical, Kris and I will link up with my college roommate and his wife in Rutland, Vermont. We will enjoy some time in Vermont and we plan to ride

the bike trail that the youth from Lakeview helped rebuild several years ago in Rutland. We will then travel to Mount Desert Island Maine with Kevin and Sue and experience several days of bike riding on the 55 miles of carriage roads built by the Rockefellers in Acadia National Park. A whale watching tour will be part of our Maine visit as well. Kris and I will then travel down the eastern seaboard and spend a couple days in Boston. It will be a history tour in that city and who knows, maybe we'll dump some tea in the harbor. From Boston we'll travel through Philadelphia, Baltimore, Washington DC and New York City (likely not stopping in NYC, although I'd love to). We will end up at the usual spot on Folly Beach South Carolina where our son, daughter and son-in-law will be able It wouldn't be summer to join us. without time on Folly! I plan to be back at church on August 24.

By the way, although we have some great plans for sabbatical, some of my time will also be spent doing things at home that I just haven't been able to get done. For example, we moved back into the house 4 years ago after the explosion and I've never had a chance to paint the new exterior front and back doors. You know about those kinds of household projects!

It is my hope and prayer that you also will take advantage of this sabbatical, that you will join in the conversation

hosted by the church council and outlined in this newsletter and that you will seriously contemplate the future of mission and ministry at Lakeview. When we regroup next fall, we will be excited to keep moving forward with new ideas and fresh mindsets. You know that I've always said that ministry should never be allowed to plateau. We should never be content to stay at the level we are at. We should always keep on taking risks and trying new things and serving in new ways in the world God has given us.

So, I hope each of you has a refreshing summer. I hope you reconnect with others. I hope that you will hold Lakeview dear in your hearts and that you will enjoy worship with Pastor Ron Mach in my absence. Be safe. Be grateful. Be disciples.
