Advent

The new church year begins with the season of Advent on Nov 28/29. Advent is a 4-week period of time that precedes Christmas. It is a time to prepare, to wait, to consider the past and anticipate the future. This year, like last year, all Advent worship services will be held in the main sanctuary (*including Saturday evenings*). Instead of using the assigned weekend lectionary readings during Advent we will be reading the first chapter of the Gospel of Luke. These stories lead us to the birth of Jesus from chapter 2 which we will then read on Christmas Eve. There will be special music during Advent services. Weekly themes in Advent:

Dec 12/13 Mary Visits Elizabeth Dec 19/20 The Birth of John Dec 24 The Birth of Jesus

Special Advent Collections

Again this year, we will do a special collection during the four weeks of Advent. This year it is going to be a "non-food" drive for our Lakeview Food Pantry. THE KITCHEN PROJECT

Kitchen Fund Raising Task Group

The kitchen fundraising task group was established immediately after the Congregation Meeting on Sept 27. This group has been meeting and has a great deal of enthusiasm and creativity about finding ways to fund the renovation of the kitchen. They have begun applying for grants. They have established some upcoming fundraisers in the congregation that will promote the kitchen, fellowship and raise money. They are exploring a policy to rent our chapel to community folks who may be interested in a wedding or other appropriate event there. They are staying in touch with the church treasurer about possible future loans for the project. They have explored the Mission Investment Fund with the ELCA. Rest assured that wise, careful decisions about this project are being made. On Dec 5/6 this task group will give a brief presentation before each worship service. Thank you to Gayle Langer for chairing this group and to Christine Stamm, Lynn Case, Lyle Fenske, Corrine Greiber, Todd Schaack, and Sterling Lynk, who have been working on this project. Also, thank you to Mary Cragin and Verallyn Cline who have served as advisors to this group. There is lots of work to do as we move forward on this project. Of course, if someone is hiding a large sum of money that they would want to donate to fund this project, we could immediately disband this ad hoc committee! Thank you to everyone for supporting the kitchen update project.

Pack the Truck Kitchen Fundraiser

Lakeview church will be partnering with Easter Seals of Wisconsin for a Pack the Truck fundraiser. This event runs from now through noon on December 28th. You can donate bags of your unwanted clothing, comforters, blankets, towels, sheets, shoes and purses. Anything made from cloth will be accepted. Items are resold or reused and anything that is not usable is recycled. Bring your bags into the office entrance area. You can leave your bags and collect a tax receipt. Yes! All items donated to this fundraiser are tax deductible. Our goal is to collect 600+ bags of donations. Easter Seals will pay Lakeview Lutheran 20 cents per pound of items donated. That means 600 bags is worth about \$3,000 for our kitchen fund. Further information and Easter Seals brochures can be found in the Narthex. Pass the word to your relatives, friends, and neighbors to bring their tax deductible donations to your Thanksgiving dinners. Pick up your receipts ahead of time. Recognizing Sterling Lynk

Sterling Lynk is a young man who was baptized, confirmed and married at Lakeview. He has been a lifetime member of this congregation and was recently accepted into the Master's of Divinity program at Luther Seminary in St. Paul, MN. Luther is one of the eight seminaries in the country operated by the ELCA. Sterling was also recently approved by the synod candidacy committee to be on track for ordination as an ELCA pastor upon completion of his academic degree. It is part of the constitution of our congregation that we will seek out and encourage qualified persons to prepare for the ministry of the gospel. It's been many years since this has happened at Lakeview. seminary process is a four-year period of time. As a way to support and uplift Sterling in his call, we will set aside Dec 5 and 6 at worship to recognize him, to have him participate in worship and to provide a special financial offering to him that can be used to purchase books and academic supplies at seminary.

Summer Youth Trip

Because of circumstances, Pastor Dean has not been able to plan the summer youth trips until recently. With the help of Nate Campbell, an interesting cultural experience, at a lower cost than typical, has been planned. This year, the trip will be a combined experience for both middle school and high school youth. The group will depart from Lakeview after worship on August 7 and return late on August 12. There are 21 slots for youth on this trip and 4 slots for adult chaperones. Vans have been rented to transport the group to Whispering Pines Retreat Center on Shawano Lake. Whispering Pines is a great location in the woods with swimming and sand volleyball available. The group will cook their own meals in a nice kitchen. Beds are provided, but everyone will need to provide their own bed linens. During the days in Shawano County, the youth will be exposed to a unique cultural mix in the area. They will spend time on the Menomonee Indian Reservation, time on the Stockbridge Muncie Indian Reservation, time within the Amish community near Bonduel and time with the Mormon Community in Gresham. They will experience service opportunities in

these locations, living history museums, unusual wildlife and phenomenal forest and river experiences. Fishing is also a possibility. An evening will be spent having a picnic and enjoying kayaks, paddleboats and swimming at the Kirst cottage on Koonz Lake. The highlight of the trip may be to experience the Stockbridge Muncie Pow-wow before returning to Madison. The cost per youth for this trip is \$500. Students may pay the full

amount or make a deposit of \$100 to register and then fundraise the remainder of the funds. A registration form is included in this newsletter. Slots will be given on a first come, first serve basis. Guests are welcome. Youth who are currently in grades 6 through 12 are welcome to register. Parents of youth who register will be called on to help with appropriate fundraising after the first of the year.
