

The Future of In-Person Worship

Nobody is more disappointed over how the Covid pandemic is affecting worship than Pastor Dean. Right now, he and the council simply cannot tell you when we might be able to return to meeting in the sanctuary. The number of hospitalizations in our community continues to be high. The number of positive cases also remains at high levels. And as long as there are super spreader events held without regard to mitigation, we will likely not see those numbers decrease soon. The Wisconsin Council of Churches continues to discourage any in person worship at this time. So stay posted. If it looks safe, we will make a fast decision---maybe just days before we gather. The church Realm email system, Facebook page and church voice mail will provide updates when they occur. For now, we will continue to provide a Zoom option and record the service each Sunday. Terry Warnke will continue to edit those services and post them on the Facebook page, church .website and YouTube later in the day. Hang in there!

Food Pantry

The food pantry continues to see high numbers of users each week. It is clear that our pantry is serving a vital need in our community at this time---although it always has. The pantry will continue as a drive through pantry this fall/winter. People wishing to use the pantry get their car in line between 4:30 and 6:30 every Monday evening. Remember, members of the congregation are invited to use the pantry also. Guests of the pantry do not get out of their cars. We have some hardy hard-working volunteers to make this happen and who shop, unload deliveries and keep the shelves full. At this time, the financial situation in the pantry is excellent, thanks to many gifts from you. It is not necessary to make financial gifts to the pantry right now. If and when that situation changes, we will gladly put out a request. Thank you to everyone for supporting this ministry.

All Saints Worship

The annual All Saints worship will certainly look different this year. However, on November 1 we will celebrate the saints like usual and we will lift up those who have departed from our Lakeview family this past year. On November 1, we will remember Barbara Erickson and Lyle Fenske. Candles will be lighted, and flowers will be placed. Although their families will not be able to be present in the sanctuary, they will be invited to participate via Zoom or to watch the service later on YouTube.

This year Ronda Richard made and donated 104 quilts to Lutheran World Relief. This will be her final year for quilt making, as she is retiring from it after many years and many quilts! Thank you to all the members who have contributed material to assist with this ministry.

Sanctuary Video Projector

Unfortunately, the video projector used for worship in our sanctuary bit the dust recently. The projector is over 15 years old and parts are no longer available. The council would like to replace the projector soon and have received bids for \$6500 for a laser projector. We hope that the new projector can be ready for the Christmas services, so that we can bring music into them from Lakeview members that has been pre-recorded. It is very unlikely that we will be able to offer live music or carol singing in the sanctuary this year, regardless of what we are doing for worship. If you would be able to make a contribution toward this projector, it would be greatly appreciated. Yes, it is unfortunate that so many things have required repair or replacement recently. No one planned for this!

Parking Lot Lights

Pastor Dean has met with representatives from the clerk's office. Warner Park is housing the Porchlight Men's Shelter because of the pandemic. If you are not coming to the building to vote on November 3, please do **NOT** come to the building. We are trying to keep anyone out of the building who doesn't need to be here. The staff will not be here, and the office will be closed. East Hall will not be available for any food pantry activity that day either. You will not even be able to access the pantry. So, if you have not already done so, remember to vote, but only come to the church building on November 3 to do just that. Thank you.

Drive Thru Lasagna Dinner

Remember, if you or someone you know would like to participate in the lasagna dinner on Tuesday evening, November 17, you MUST make a reservation with the church office on or before Friday, November 13. Pastor Dean will be preparing and cooking the meal (*from scratch*). When you make your reservation, you will need to know how many meat and how many vegetable servings for your order. Pick up of meals will be from 4:30 to 6:00 pm in the south parking lot. Meals will be brought to your car by volunteers. You will not enter the building.

Obviously, we will not be able to host our annual Thanksgiving Dinner this year. This is a great disappointment to many, both diners and volunteers. Hopefully this ministry will be able to return, in some fashion, in 2021.

Meeting With Pastor Steve

Pastor Steve Kottke is the assistant to our synod bishop. He is the person in that office who will work directly with this congregation to establish an interim pastor to begin here in January. Pastor Steve will also work with the council to write a profile of Lakeview that will then be used for potential pastors to consider interviewing here in the future. The council will establish a call committee under Pastor Steve's guidance. The process will take some time and that's okay. There is a lot of Pastor Dean in this place after 19 plus years of being here. Gregg Steinhauer will lead the council to clear Pastor Dean from Lakeview and provide a path for a new pastor in this congregation. This will be an exciting time for Lakeview and there is a dedicated council and a dedicated bishop's staff to make sure that the best connections can be made for the future of this congregation. Pastor Dean will hold you all and this process in his prayers,

and remember he'll be retired, so he he'll have plenty of time to pray!!!!!!

Protocol When a Pastor Leaves

When a pastor leaves a congregation, they are encouraged to make a complete break. That is the healthy way. A new pastor, either an interim, initially, or by call, eventually, will be put into place to meet the pastoral needs of members of the congregation and friends. Therefore, the former pastor is discouraged from preforming pastoral acts like visits, counseling, communion, weddings, funerals, baptisms, etc. This is not easy for the congregation and it's not easy for the pastor, but it's healthy. It's what allows the new person to come with their unique gifts and ideas. It's what allows a new person to develop strong relationships and lead responsible ministry in a congregation without intrusion from a former leader. It may be difficult, but it is necessary. There is no doubt that the next person "will not be Pastor Dean." A WORD FROM PASTOR DEAN

Dear Friends, (this is the Christmas tree request)

Since we know that we will not be able to gather together in a large group for Christmas Eve this year, I have a request for all of you—and I mean ALL. I would like to put a large lighted tree in the sanctuary. Then I would like to ask each of you to make an ornament for that tree that includes your picture or the picture of your household members. I would like to decorate the sanctuary tree with pictures of all the Lakeview members as a reminder that, even though we can't be physically present to celebrate the birth of Christ, we are present in God's spirit. We know that Christmas trees have nothing to do with the birth of Jesus. But people do. And the relationships that we've established have everything to do with the life and ministry of Jesus. That's why the ornaments need our pictures.

You can make your ornaments as simple or as elaborate as you would like. It would be a fun activity for the members of your household to engage in together. The only requirement is that your ornament include pictures *(individuals or household)*. Then get your ornament to church, so that we can begin putting them on for November 29 *(First Weekend in Advent)*. Each week in Advent we will make sure that Terry's recording of the service includes a close up of the Christmas tree and the faces of our community gathering here. Some ornaments may be able to be mailed. Others may be delicate and will have to be dropped off at the office. Any ornaments that come before November 29 will go on the tree immediately and the rest will go on as they arrive during Advent. I want to encourage you to participate in this activity.

When I retire on December 31, I want to take all the ornaments with me as a remembrance of the wonderful people in this place and the relationships that Kris and I have made here in the name of our Savior. That is why I hope you will all participate. By the way, ornaments can be funny, too. Make them to reflect your personality, so that Kris and I will look at it and remember that aspect of who you are! So, for Kris and I, and for the community, put your creativity to work soon.

I have had the opportunity to spend 20 Christmas Eves with you. I consider myself blessed that together we have remembered our Savior's birth together that often. While I have many memories of those worship services, I will always hold up the memory of Anthony Dupre. One year on Christmas Eve when he was very young, he came forward for the Children's Message with a group of kids. I asked if they knew the story that I was about to tell them. Anthony's response was classic, "Of course we do, you tell the same story every year!" And that, in fact, is true Anthony. We do tell that wonderful story of our Savior's birth year after year. Every year we set aside a time to reflect that the Savior of the world came to live as a human in the being of Jesus. Every year we spend time remember that Jesus was "God with flesh on." And every year, through that Christmas Eve story, we leave with the call to make that Christ known in the world through our words and our actions. We will do that again this year and in my bittersweet feelings of leaving this place that I love, I will rejoice that I get to celebrate that gift with you one more time. So make me an ornament!!! I don't want to hear any whining about your lack of creativity or artistic skills. Everyone can do this. I have asked you to do much more difficult stuff than this over the years and most of you have complied. So just do it! Thank you.
