Protocols for Attending In-Person Worship

After service, exit through the main doors off the narthex.

Lakeview Lutheran Church Council Annual Congregational Meeting Minutes

January 31, 2021

CALL TO ORDER / CREDENTIALS REPORT

The meeting was called to order at 9:38 a.m. by President Gregg Steinhauer. Pastor Mary Pharmer led in an opening prayer.

There were 44 members present, and Gregg declared a quorum.

APPROVAL OF AGENDA

Gregg adopted a motion to approve the meeting's agenda. Since there were no objections to this motion, the motion to approve this agenda was adopted by unanimous consent.

APPROVAL OF JANUARY 26, 2020 MINUTES

Gregg adopted a motion to approve the minutes from the last annual meeting, which was held on January 26, 2020. Since there were no objections to this motion, the motion to approve the minutes was adopted by unanimous consent.

APPROVAL OF JUNE 28, 2020 MINUTES

Gregg adopted a motion to approve the minutes from the special congregational meeting, which was held on June 28, 2020. Since there were no objections to this motion, the motion to approve the minutes was adopted by unanimous consent.

PRESIDENT'S REPORT

Gregg took the opportunity to reflect on Pastor Dean's leadership at Lakeview Lutheran Church over the last 20 years.

He reviewed how resilient Lakeview's congregation has remained throughout the turmoil of this past year. He feels through its generosity and selflessness, the church body has shown how united in Christ it has been. As the congregation begins its search for a new pastor in 2021, Gregg calls on the church body's strength and wisdom to find new leadership.

LAKEVIEW CEMETERY REPORT

Linda Schaack reviewed the 2020 Lakeview Cemetery Operations report. There were no large or unusual transactions. In August 2020, the cemetery checking account was closed and the balance put into the church checking account. Assets in this fund total approximately \$137,700 as of 12/31/2020.

Gregg adopted a motion to approve the 2020 Lakeview Cemetery Operations report. There were no objections to this motion, and the motion to approve the report was adopted by unanimous consent.

LAKEVIEW CHURCH ENDOWMENT AND CHAPEL ENDOWMENT REPORT

Linda Schaack reviewed 2020 activity in the church endowment and chapel endowment funds, which are a group of assets set aside for the benefit of church and the chapel. The funds generally grow as a result of a memorial gift, specific donation or investment earnings. The church endowment and memorial value is presently \$55,150. The chapel endowment and memorial value is presently \$40,005.

The total church and chapel endowment and memorial fund balance is \$95,155.

Gregg adopted a motion to approve the Church Endowment and Chapel Endowment Report dated 12/31/2020. There were no objections to this motion, and the motion to approve the report was adopted by unanimous consent.

TREASURER'S REPORT – LINDA SCHAACK

Linda Schaack reported that 2020 revenues and expenses were both under the budgeted amounts. Total revenue was \$284,071 and expenses were \$284,343, a shortfall of \$272. Lakeview qualified for a Payroll Protection Plan loan of \$37,000, which was used in full for payroll and utility costs. The loan is expected to be fully forgiven. The congregation provided additional financial support for several high cost projects during 2020, for a total extra support giving of \$64,600.

There were no objections to the proposed 2020 financial report, so Gregg adopted a motion to approve it. The motion to approve the 2020 financial report was adopted by unanimous consent.

Linda presented the council approved 2021 Ministry Plan. The proposed increase in giving is 3% over the 2020 actual giving. Projected expenses were estimated by averaging the 2020 'lower' amounts (due to the pandemic and the building being closed) and the 'normal' 2019 amounts.

Gregg adopted a motion to approve the 2021 Ministry Plan. There were no objections to this motion, and the motion to approve the 2021 Ministry Plan was adopted by unanimous consent.

ELECTIONS

Gregg announced Amy Luebke has completed two 2-year terms on church council as vice president. Annette Pownell has been nominated to fill the vice president vacancy. Patty Manier has completed two 2year terms as church council secretary. Dave Haselow has been nominated to fill the secretary vacancy. Returning council member Linda Schaack has been nominated to serve another 1-year term on church council as treasurer. Gregg Steinhauer has been nominated to serve another 2-year term on church council as president.

Gregg adopted a motion to elect the following to church council: Annette Pownell as vice president, Dave Haselow as secretary, Linda Schaack as treasurer and Gregg Steinhauer as president. There were no objections to this motion, and the motion to approve these positions on church council was approved by unanimous consent.

CALL FOR NEW BUSINESS

Gregg called for any new business. There was none.

Gregg thanked all attendees for their participation in the annual meeting.

Gregg adopted a motion to adjourn the meeting. There were no objections to this motion, and the motion to adjourn the meeting was approved by unanimous consent. The meeting was adjourned at 10:17 a.m.

- Regular
 - Work your plan by giving a regular offering to Lakeview weekly or monthly offerings are usually the most common. Offerings can also be mailed to the church or made online through Vanco.
 - Generous
 - o Generosity is a sign of the Holy Spirit working in your life. How has God been generous to you in your life, and how can you be generous in what you offer to support Lakeview?
 - First

o Give your offering first rather than waiting until later in the month to see if you have anything left over. Again, making a plan and giving online can help with this.

- Proportional
 - What percentage of your income do you give as your offering to the church? While a full tithe of 10% may be too much for many of us, can you give 3%, or 5%? "From everyone to whom much has been given, much will be required" Jesus.
 - Cheerful
 - o Giving our offerings to the church in support of the ministry God has called us to do is not a bad thing. Instead, it is meant to be a joyful, exciting opportunity for us to help out with the work that God is already doing here at Lakeview. St. Paul's says, "Each of you must give as you have made up your mind, not reluctantly or under compulsion, for God loves a cheerful giver."

FROM THE INTERIM PASTOR'S DESK...

Hello, For a While

Hello. I'm Pastor Robb Kosky.

I will be your Interim Pastor for the next year or so, at which time, if all goes fairly smoothly (and after 2020, we all know how things can, all of the sudden, not go smoothly at all), but, as I said, if all goes smoothly, you will all be eager to see me go and ready to welcome your next called pastor – whomever he or she may be.

That will be a time of celebration, because we will then see how God had been at work among us during this intervening year, you will have done the work necessary to be ready to call a new pastor, and God will be calling me on to yet another stage in my ministry. In the meantime, we are here together in this time of transition, moving from a past which was familiar to us, into a future which is unknown and therefore holds both anxiety and possibility.

The story of your familiar past you all know quite well. I know a little bit about your story and look forward to learning more in the months to come.

Right now, I can tell you a bit about my story, and just like Lakeview, I am also in a time of transition. I was ordained as a pastor in the ELCA the same month as Pastor Dean, in June of 1997, and came to the South-Central Synod of Wisconsin. I, however, was considerably younger than Dean (and I still am). I served a two-point parish in Bagley and Cassville for about a year and a half. During that time, I met my wife, Lisa, who is also a pastor in our Synod. She was in the process of leaving her congregation in Wiota and beginning a call to serve at Bethel in Madison. After we were married, I took a call to serve St. Paul's in Waterloo. This was in 1999, while Dean was still serving at Our Savior's in Sun Prairie. Lisa and I also moved to Sun Prairie and I continued to be the pastor at St. Paul's until last month.

Dean and I were both what are known as long-term pastors. These are pastors who have served in the same congregation for more than about seven years. And let's face it, seven years was a long time ago for both me at St. Paul's, and Dean, here at Lakeview. There are a lot of blessings for both congregations and for pastors from long-term pastorates. And there are quite a few pitfalls as well.

I know that St. Paul's and I experienced many of those blessings, and I am sure that you all did also with Dean. I also know that we did not manage to avoid all of the pitfalls. I am sure that this is true for you all as well. And that is okay. We are a people who confess "that we are captive to sin and cannot free ourselves." God does not expect us to be perfect, either as pastors or as congregations. I am not perfect, nor is St. Paul's a perfect congregation. And I fully expect that neither you, nor Dean, have been perfect over these past years.

Now, we are called to transition, from a past that we are familiar with, to a future that is unknown. Together, we will remember the past. Together, we will recognize the ways in which we have answered God's call and the familiar ways in which we have worshiped and done ministry. And together, we will discern the new ways in which God is calling us into the future.

And then, after all goes smoothly, you will be good and ready to say good-bye to me, and to welcome a new Called Pastor to journey with you into the possibilities that God is calling you to.
