Fun Facts!

- The congregation was organized by Rev. L. Habel in 1856 as a sister church of St. John's of Madison, being served by their pastors.
- From 1856 to 1946 our congregation was known as St. John's Lutheran Church of Westport. Due to the maple sugar industry in this area, our church was often referred to as the "Zuckerbusch Kirche" (Sugarbush Church).
- Until the chapel was built (1884), the congregation held its services in a small, white, school house on Sherman Ave. where Sherman School stands.

This acceptance and love of all of God's people has been a part of Lakeview's identity and practice since 2008. Lakeview's council is hoping to make this acceptance and welcome of all members of our community more intentional and explicit in the life of our congregation.

ReconcilingWorks offers online training courses to help congregations and church members grow in their understanding LGBTQIA+ identities and expand their work of welcome, inclusion, hospitality, and celebration of LGBTQIA+ people in their communities and congregations.

Online training courses are offered from 5:30 – 7:00 on evenings throughout the summer and fall. Courses include: Let's Talk about SOGIE (Learning about Sex, Gender Identity, Gender Expression, and Sexual Orientation); Consent in Community Building; and Bias and its Impact on Welcome. FROM THE INTERIM PASTOR'S DESK...

Moving into Summer, and Still Moving Forward

The weather is getting warmer, Lisa and I have been transplanting flowers and starting to work in the garden, people are planning vacations, schedules change, and things are a little more relaxed. We are moving into summer, and while we are moving into summer, we are still moving forward here at Lakeview.

We are moving forward with some warm weather activities. With some warm weather, Dennis and Phil were finally able to fix the chapel steps. My wife, Lisa, loves to transplant flowers and we ended up with some extra Irises which I brought over to the church and Laura and I planted them outside the office entrance and around to the front of the church, and a few up by the chapel.

But we are doing more than the outside work. We are also moving forward by taking some more steps toward normalcy with our worship services, and the Council and Call Committee are moving forward with the transition work needed to get ready to call a Pastor.

Moving Forward with Worship

The doors are open! If you stop by the office during office hours you will find that we have now unlocked the doors and opened up for visitors to stop by. We are still asking that you wear a mask, but please stop by to visit. Also, the front doors to the narthex and sanctuary will be open for our Saturday and Sunday services. You can still come in through the handicap entrance at the front of the sanctuary, but now, if you're running late you will be able to sneak in from the back. The downstairs doors will also be open on Sunday mornings.

Warmer weather. When the warmer weather arrives this summer, we will move our worship services downstairs to East Hall to take advantage of the air conditioning. We will let you know through weekly announcements when this will be happening. You can also look for the welcome flag that we put before our services – if you see it down in front of East Hall, we will be worshipping down there.

Communion Distribution and Masks. As of right now we are not making any changes to how we are distributing communion or to the wearing of masks, but we will be considering these questions in the coming weeks. I would appreciate any opinions you have about the wearing of masks in worship and about returning to a more traditional way of distributing communion.

In person Bible Study. This isn't about worship, but I thought I would throw it in here. Our Wednesday Bible Study will begin meeting in-person on Wednesday, May 26th at 10:30 in the Fellowship Room. I will still have my computer if you would like to join by Zoom.

The Council and Call Committee Are Moving Forward

There are a lot of steps to be taken before we will be ready to submit our Ministry Site Profile to the Synod and begin to interview candidates for the position of Lakeview's Pastor, and the Council and Call Committee are getting started on this work.

Audits, Constitutions, and Video Equipment

The council has made arrangements for an audit of Lakeview's financial records to be carried out, and has also begun to look at updating the Constitution and congregational policies. The council has also approved Terry Warnke's proposal for purchasing equipment and developing a system for live-streaming Lakeview's worship services. (The council approved \$3,000 for equipment and other expenses. Members are invited to make donations to help defray this cost they can be designated for "Service Recording Equipment.") This will also allow volunteers to help operate our video equipment with just a little training.

Looking into the Past to Move into the Future

The Call Committee is putting together an exercise to help us all look back at the history of Lakeview, and especially at our members' stories of Lakeview. What have been the high and low points of your life here? How has God been at work through the ministry of Lakeview in the past, and where is God calling Lakeview to move forward in the future? Please keep your eyes open for updates from the Call Committee, notices on Facebook, and especially for the Lakeview Timeline that will be posted in the sanctuary.

More to Come

And we have more work to do. We will make sure that our membership records are up to date, examine the church property and building, move forward to become a "Reconciled in Christ" congregation (an official designation for Lutheran Churches that, like Lakeview, are welcoming and accepting of people of all sexual orientations and gender identities), we will be look at our synodical, ecumenical, and community involvement, examine demographics and think about how we might continue to grow in reaching out to people in our community for purposes of evangelism and social ministry.

We have a lot of work to do. And while we all plan to enjoy the warm weather and the summer, we will still be moving forward here at Lakeview.
